- Halstead, Home Depot and Välinge enter into a confidential settlement agreement
- Case relating to Isocore, Lifeproof, Allure Ultra and Home Decorators branded products is withdrawn on the parties' joint request
- Halstead-Home Depot continue to produce and sell luxury vinyl products
